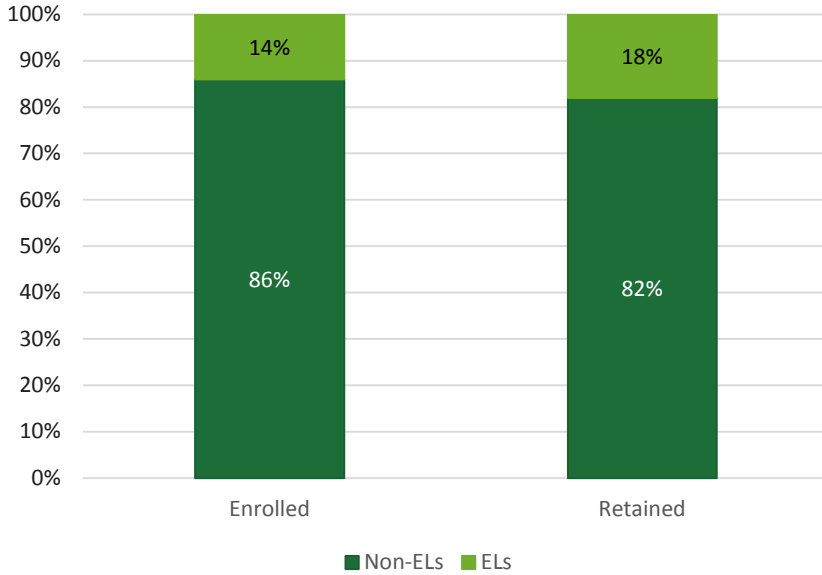




Retention and Suspension of English Learners (ELs)

Percentage of ELs and Non-ELs Enrolled and Retained in Elementary School (Grades K-6): SY 2011-12

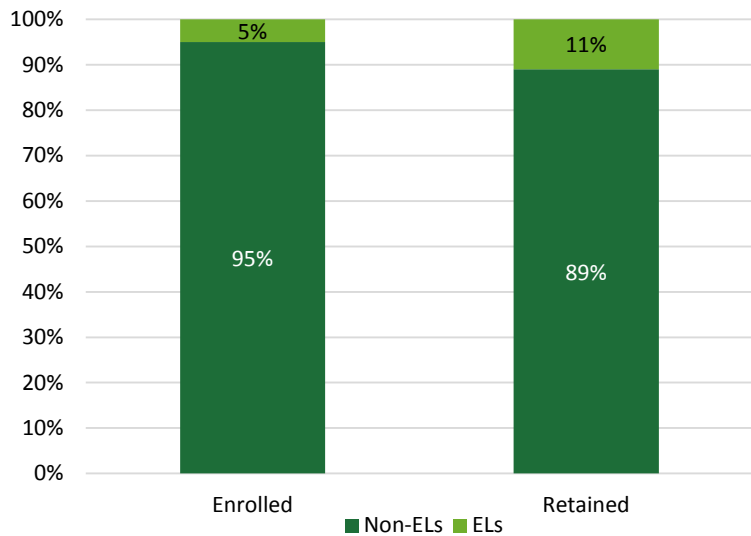


Fact

Percentages of ELs and Non-ELs Enrolled and Retained in High School (Grades 9-12): SY 2011-12

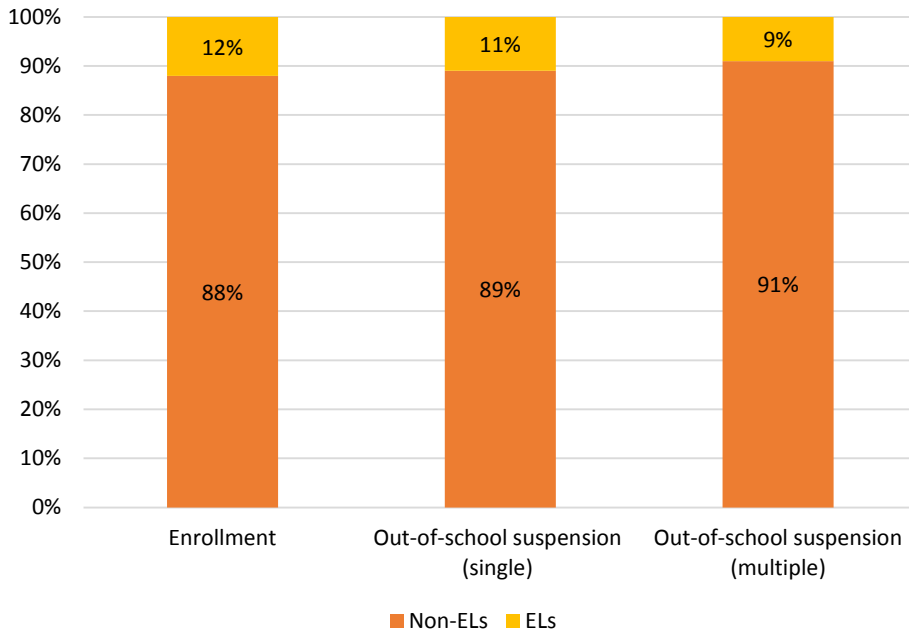


Fact

Percentage of Preschool ELs and Non-ELs Enrolled and Receiving Single or Multiple Out-of-School Suspensions: SY 2011-12

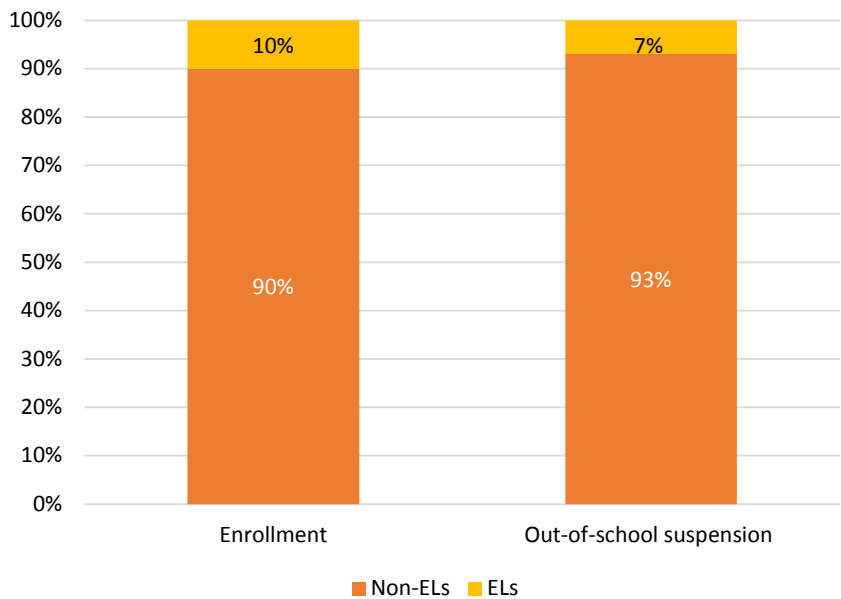


Fact
